The Asia Center at ASU invites competitive proposals from ASU faculty seeking to fund travel to Asia to conduct research. The travel grants had been paused in cent years due to travel restrictions and the Center is pleased to be able to resume this decades-long tradition awarding travel funds supported by the A.T. Steele Endowment. This year, awards of the A.T. Steele Faculty Travel Grant will range up to \$4,000 each. Submissions are due January 15, 2025.

ELIGILIBITY

All ASU faculty conducting research in Asia are eligible to apply. The Center's affiliated faculty are strongly encouraged to apply.
